## THE BIG WRITE

On Mondays to Thursdays, there will be English and Read, Write Inc lessons. We compliment these lessons on a Friday in two ways. Every other week we will work together on a dedicated grammar and punctuation session, and on the other Fridays we will continue to hold a Big Write. Every two weeks your child will bring home a talk homework with the task of discussing with you their plan for their 'Big Write' on Friday. Please take time to talk about their ideas and help them by sharing your ideas too as these will make a difference. For example you could give them 'WOW' words, or ideas for developing their writing. The children will receive feedback on their work, both on what they have done well and what they can do to improve it further.

## **MATHS**

Lessons are taught using a wide range of resources and strategies to encourage children to see the maths 'all around them'. If you are able to come in and talk to the class about how you use maths everyday then please get in touch. We cover a range of units that give children the opportunity to learn about numbers, calculating, money, time, data handling, shapes, measures and problem solving. We will be continuing with the learning ladders where your child is the boss of their own maths learning.

#### **HOMEWORK**

Reading at home is part of your child's homework. We expect children to read at least three times a week at home. Their reading record is checked daily and house points are given to those children who have read.

Homework sheets linked to Read, Write Inc will be sent home 3 to 4 times a week. These could be sheets asking the children to share the sound they have been focusing on that day, or words to read or spell linked to particular sounds or books they are reading.

Year 2 children will be given one piece of grammar homework from their book every Friday to be handed in the following Thursday. They will also receive weekly spellings on Monday to give them time to practise for a quiz the following Monday.

Year 1 children will receive weekly common exception words to learn to read as quick as a click then as we progress through the year learn to spell.

A Blooms project will also be sent home every term. Your child can choose a variety of activities to meet their learning styles. The whole family are welcome to offer support with this homework.

Maths homework - to practise their maths skills using the Abacus online games. Every child has their individual username and password.

#### READING
