## Secondary Transfer and Reception Places

If you have a child in Year 6 please make sure you have completed your child's Secondary transfer form online by the 31st October 2018

If you require a reception place for your child in September 2019 you must complete a form by 15th January 2019. NB: Even if your child currently attends our Nursery they will not automatically be given a place unless you complete the form. ## Important information about our cashless school

Please can we remind you that there should be no cash coming into school now apart from Lunch Money which needs to be brought into school on a Monday in an envelope with your child's name and class on and the days that lunch is required.

All before and afterschool care needs to be booked and paid for 24hours in advance online. This enables us to plan for staff.

Swimming & trips also need to be paid online.

Any afterschool clubs that your child could attend will be showing on your child's account so please don't worry if you see clubs that your child doesn't attend. Only pay for the things you know your child will be accessing.

Please feel free to come and talk to Mrs, Emery, Miss Buckland or Mrs Mankee if you are still having issues.

Follow the instructions on the screen and enter your details and add the <a href="unique online link code">unique online link code</a> for your child which you should have received from us in the mail. If you require your link code again please ask Mrs Mankee or Mrs Emery.

It is very import that you get yourself registered as from the 19th October we will not be accepting any cash.

## Free School Meals

Just a reminder that all of the children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 receive universal free school meals.

This is a government initiative and it looks like the children are really enjoying the wide range of food! The kitchen staff are doing a fantastic job and are providing really lovely meals—three choices each day! There is usually a meat choice, a vegetarian choice or a Jacket Potato with a range of fillings. There is always a choice of desserts, a salad bar and freshly baked bread.

Part of our school budget is made up of what is called "Pupil Premium" and this is largely based on the amount of children in the school who are entitled to free school meals. Unfortunately, with the free school meals for all infants initiative, we are at risk of this part of the school budget being greatly reduced if eligible parents do not still apply. We are therefore urging all parents who feel that they may be eligible, regardless of whether their child does or does not take up the meal, or whether they are an infant already receiving free meals, to apply. Any parents would be eligible to apply if they are in receipt of any of the following benefits: Income Support; Income based Job Seeker's Allowance; Income Related Support Allowance; Child Tax Credit with an annual income of no more than £16,190.

Please collect a form from Mrs Mankee in the school office. If you have any queries regarding this, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

Remember if you are eligible and do not apply, our school and your child is missing out on valuable funds.

# Learning Ambassador Elections

Dear Parents,

The children received the following information this week—please support your child in preparing their speeches ready for Monday when they will present to their peers. Many thanks.

As you know at the beginning of every academic year we hold elections to appoint Learning Ambassadors to serve on our Learning Council. One child from each class (Year 2 - Year 6) will be elected by their class mates to represent the views of the class at the learning council meetings. This is a very important and responsible role in the school. Last year our brilliant learning ambassadors achieved the Bronze PADL award and this year we are hoping to achieve our Silver award. 
