#### Breakfast Club & Afterschool Childcare Bookings

A polite reminder to parents that bookings should be made in advance for breakfast and after school club childcare. Bookings should also be paid for in advance.

The school needs to be informed no later than 3.30p.m the day before a place is required. The clubs are getting quite busy so spaces are limited and it is vitally important that we know numbers so there is the right level of adult supervision and the right amount of breakfast or snack available. We do understand that there are occasional emergencies and we will obviously support families if and when these unforeseen situations arise.

If less than 24 hours notice is given to cancel a booked place, parents will still be charged.
