If less than 24 hours notice is given to cancel a booked place, parents will still be charged. Also we ask all parents to sign their children out so there will be a charge for any late pick ups



Rainbow MAT Performance - Important information

The children will be rehearsing during the day on the 26th March from 9.30a.m -2.30p.m.They will be transported to and from the theatre by coach for the rehearsal with school staff. They will need to bring a packed lunch and drink with them (no fizzy drinks please) in a small ruck sack.

Parents are responsible for ensuring children arrive at the Regal in Redruth on the **evening of the 26^{th} March 2019 at 5.45p.m**. Children need to be dropped to the rear door of the theatre where a member of school staff will be waiting to greet them. Parents will then need to enter through the main front entrance to take their seats and the performance will start promptly at 6.30p.m.

Collecting children - Please collect your child from the car park at the rear of the cinema at the end of the performance. It will be quite busy - please be patient.
