What have we been up to?

EYFS In Squirrel's and Hedgehogs Class we have been learning our letter sounds and names and how to blend sounds together. We have been practising drawing patterns and writing letters to help us write our own names so we can independently label our work. Every day we practise counting up to 20 and have learnt lots of counting songs to help us. We use objects to help us count and have been practising how to count carefully, counting from left to right, touching or moving each object as we count. For our weekly PE sessions, we have been practising how to throw, catch, kick and roll a large ball, move around a space safely and in different ways. Sometimes we have stayed inside our class for PE and have completed a yoga session. We are practising changing our shoes too! In our art sessions we have learnt about a famous artists Frida Kahlo and have looked at her self-portraits before drawing and painting our self-portraits...which of course are far more amazing!



New Lunch Menu

After half term there will be a new lunch menu with a lot of new choices. Your child will have brought home a new menu today. Please note that school meals have increased to £2.34 a day. Chartwell's are still offering the buy 4 meals and get the 5th free (£9.36 for the whole week)

Just a reminder that all of the in children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 received a universal free school meals.

This is a government initiative and it looks like the children are really enjoying the wide range of food! The kitchen staff are doing a fantastic job and are providing really lovely meals—three choices each day! Part of our school budget is made up of what is called "Pupil Premium" and this is largely based on the amount of children in the school who are entitled to free school meals. Unfortunately, with the free school meals for all infants initiative, we are at risk of this part of the school budget being greatly reduced if eligible parents do not still apply. We are therefore urging all parents who feel that they may be eligible, regardless of whether their child does or does not take up the meal, or whether they are an infant already receiving free meals, to apply. Any parents would be eligible to apply if they are in receipt of any of the following benefits: Income Support; Income based Job Seeker's Allowance; Income Related Support Allowance; Child Tax Credit with an annual income of no more than £16,190.

Please collect a form from Mrs Mankee in the school office. If you have any queries regarding this, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

Remember if you are eligible and do not apply our school and your child is missing out on valuable funds.

Supermarket vouchers will be given to all families entitled to this benefit for the Christmas Holiday period so please do apply if you think you may be entitled!

Children's Christmas Lunch

Our Christmas Lunch will be held on Wednesday 16th December this year. Please see the menu below.

Full payment of £2.34 will need to be in by Monday 7th December, envelopes need to have your child's name, class and "Christmas Lunch" on the front. Please ask your child to give the envelope into the classroom - no money should be handed to the office. If your child has a free school meal a lunch will automatically be ordered for them.
