

# Free School Meals

Just a reminder that all of the in children in Reception, Year 1 and 2 receive universal free school meals.

This is a government initiative and it looks like the children are really enjoying the wide range of food! The kitchen staff are doing a fantastic job and are providing really lovely meals—three choices each day! Part of our school budget is made up of what is called "Pupil Premium" and this is largely based on the amount of children in the school who are entitled to free school meals. Unfortunately, with the free school meals for all infants initiative, we are at risk of this part of the school budget being greatly reduced if eligible parents do not still apply. We are therefore urging all parents who feel that they may be eligible, regardless of whether their child does or does not take up the meal, or whether they are an infant already receiving free meals, to apply. Any parents would be eligible to apply if they are in receipt of any of the following benefits: Income Support; Income based Job Seeker's Allowance; Income Related Support Allowance; Child Tax Credit with an annual income of no more than £16,190.

Please collect a form from Mrs Mankee in the school office. If you have any queries regarding this, please do not hesitate to get in touch.

Remember if you are eligible and do not apply our school and your child is missing out on valuable funds.

# <u> Decoration for our Christmas Tree - reminder</u>

# Improving Punctuality

The school day starts at 8.55am and ends at 3.10pm. (Nursery 8.45  $\,$  - 11.45 & 12.15 - 3.15) The school gates will be locked at the following time 8.55am  $\,$  - 11.45am and 11.55am -3.00pm.

Please ensure your child is here by that time and picked up promptly at the end of the day.

(Please note the school office has now moved to the car park end of the building and also has a new entrance - anyone entering the school between the above times will need to come through the new entrance)

We are still experiencing quite a lot of disruption in the mornings with children being brought in late to school. This is upsetting for the children who are late and disruptive for the rest of the class. We politely request that all children are brought in to school on time. It is the parent's responsibility to ensure that children are punctual.

If you are late bringing your child to school please ensure that you sign them in at the office and provide a reason for why they are late and ensure their lunch is ordered. If children are not signed in correctly by the parent we cannot guarantee that they will be provided with a lunch and any children arriving later that 9.30am will be provided with a jacket potato unless a lunch has been ordered before hand.

#### Lantern Parade

As always Troon School will be taking part in the Lantern Parade in Camborne, which will take place on Friday 29<sup>th</sup> November.

Year 6 will be playing in the Samba band and the rest of the school have been invited to walk in the parade. We have three large lanterns that we will be taking and have recently made some smaller lanterns that the staff will distribute on the evening. Please note we only have a small amount so unfortunately not every chid will be able to carry one. The lanterns will contain LED lights or glow sticks. There will be no lit can-

dles. If you your child is not carrying a lantern feel free to dress up for the occasion with tinsel, baubles and lights - anything goes.

All children must be accompanied by an adult in the parade. Parents will be responsible for their own children. Troon School staff will be marshalling the event and will not be responsible for individuals.

The Parade will form up in Rectory Road, Camborne (to the side of the Parish Church) at **5pm**, and will leave at 5.30pm. Parking is available in the residential streets, although we would recommend arriving in plenty of time. The Samba band will depart Rectory Road at 5.30pm, parading around the town and arriving back outside the Parish Church at approximately 6.15pm. After the Camborne Lights Switch-On at 6.45pm we will play for another 10 minutes as the crowds disperse, and we should be able to leave by about 7.00pm.

It would be great to have a big turn out by Troon School. The parade will go ahead even if it is raining so please ensure your child is well wrapped up and wearing a coat. Children do not need to wear school uniform.

#### School Dinners - Important
