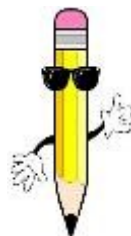

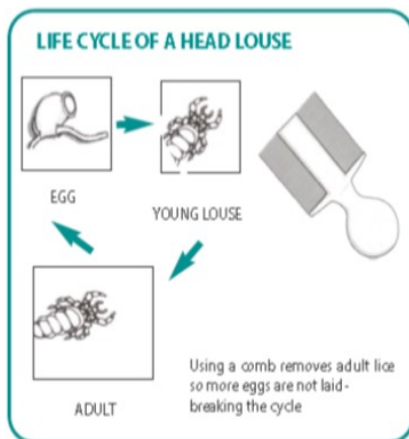

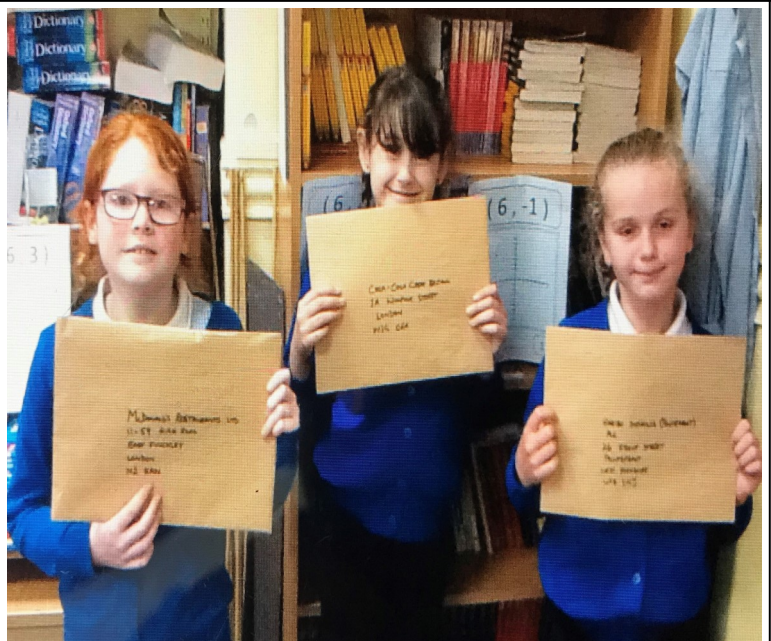

Maple Class Fight against pollution

In Year 5 we have been looking at the amount of pollution that is being washed up on British beaches. Research carried out, by the conservation charity Surfers Against Sewage, revealed the top polluting companies to be, among others, Coca Cola, McDonalds and Haribo.

The children decided that they wanted to write to these companies to highlight the problems being caused by the pollution and also to suggest ways in which they can help to improve and reduce the amount of pollution they are creating. During one Big Write, the children wrote their letters to one of the companies from the research.

11.30—Official opening of the festival

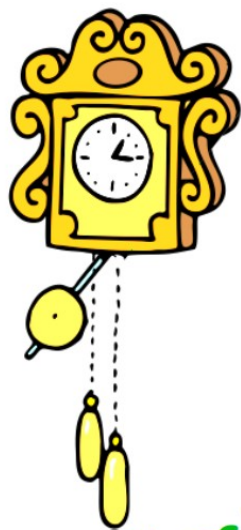
Entertainment from 12—1.30 including School choir, Vox Dance Studio and the St Agnes Band and there will be a wide range of stalls over the school site
