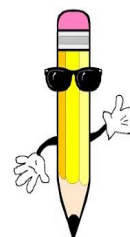

School Uniform/Winter Wear

We have some children attending school in unsuitable footwear at the moment.

Please ensure that your children come into school with the correct school uniform.

Flat black shoes (not trainers), black trousers/skirt, a white shirt, polo shirt or Troon School polo shirt and a Troon School jumper/fleece. Long hair must be tied back at all times. We also ask that children have the correct PE kit, this includes black shorts, a PE shirt and plimsoles/trainers. Also hair should be tied back. Many thanks for your support.

Please make sure that children come to school with warm/waterproof clothing: coats, hats, scarves and gloves for playtimes and the journey to and from school.

It may also be advisable for children to wear their wellies/waterproof shoes when walking in and going outside.

Please make sure they bring their inside shoes/plimsoles to school for lesson times.

Notification of Child Absences

It is very important that if your child is absent from school that you inform us and give a reason for the absence. This enables Mrs Mankee to maintain the school records so the correct information is available for the Education Welfare Officer on her termly visits. This is also very important for Nursery children as we are accountable for funded hours that nursery parents claim for their child.

Blooms Homework

Your child brought home their Blooms homework last week. The project will run from Monday 14th January until Friday 29th March. Children need to complete their chosen tasks at home and then bring them in to their teacher to share with the class. The aim is to try a range of tasks so children aren't allowed to do more than three tasks from each row. Try to complete a task each week so that you don't run out of time. The class who make the most effort with their Blooms homework this term will also receive an Easter prize to share!
