

School Uniform

PE Reminders

PE is an integral part of the curriculum taught at this School and your child should have suitable kit for PE and Games lessons. It is particularly important that they have correct fitting plimsolls or trainers. Unfortunately valuable lesson time is still being wasted in trying to sort out lack of kit for some individuals, particularly footwear.

If your child has a medical condition which affects their participation in PE lessons and daily playtimes, would you kindly provide a note to their class teacher confirming what they can and cannot do and the period that the note will cover. At the end of that period we will assume that your child is fit to recommence these normal School activities in the absence of a further note. Your continued cooperation is appreciated.


Reading tea parties
