- ◇ I know that you can print onto clay using different materials.

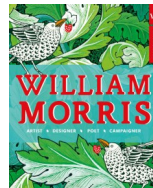

## How do I create art like William Morris?

You'll need: Thin paper, card, pencil, polystyrene sheet, printing ink/ paint, paint tray, paint roller.

Step 1: Create your design. Using your pencil, draw your picture onto the thin paper.

Step 2: Trace it. Hold your drawing in place over the polystyrene and trace it- pressing firmly.

Step 3: Spread your ink/paint into a paint tray. Use the roller to spread paint

Step 4: Position the polystyrene in one corner of your card. Press the polystyrene onto the card to firmly print your design.

Step 5: Repeat this process to create your pattern.



## What will I know by the end of this unit?

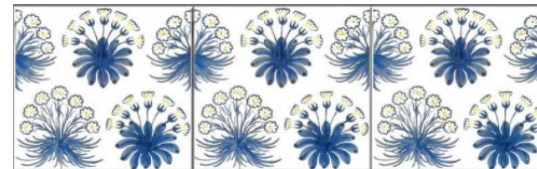
- I know that William Morris is a famous designer and printer.
