Troon Speaks

What is it?

An exciting public speaking event that gives you the opportunity to present a speech to an audience on a topic that interests you, you care about and you know really well?

Who can enter?

Anyone in Years 3-6 can enter the 'Troon Speaks' competition. The best three eligible speakers (see below), will be selected to represent the School in the 'Youth Speaks' competition organised by the Redruth Rotary Club on January 28th.

What do I have to do?

Write your speech at home as soon as possible (please ask your family for help and ideas). You will need to practise your speech at home before the 'Troon Speaks' competition on **Tuesday 18**th **December**.

First, think of something which is really important to you.

Next, work out why it interests you so much.

Then, think of as many good things about it as you can.

After that, consider what others may say about it (especially if they disagree with your ideas).

Finally, think of ways of convincing people that they should think as you do!

Here are a few ideas to help you along, although we would be delighted if you came up with some of your own: Why children should run the school!

Pocket money is a good/bad idea.

Children should only receive one present at Christmas

Every class in a school should have a pet

Children should have more control over their own learning

Palm oil is killing orang-utans

- Your speech should be between 3 and half to 4 minutes long.
- You do not need to arrange any Powerpoint presentations or visual aids, because your speech is the important thing.
- You need to <u>know your subject really well</u> as the audience will have the opportunity to ask you questions at the end of your speech.
- Try to make your speech unique
- Use a loud, clear voice and expression
- Try to include humour in your speech

What do I have to do now?

Start writing your speech (ask your adults at home to help you).
